## Introduction To Our Community Plan

Since June 2002, residents of Dookie and District have played an active role in shaping the future of their community. This marked the creation of the district's first Community Plan, developed through local consultation, and the formation of the Dookie and District Development Forum (DDDF), a group of locals to ensure the success of the plan. From this foundation, a range of projects were initiated, some successfully completed, while others naturally evolved or became less relevant as community priorities changed.

A decade later, in 2012, further consultation ensured the plan continued to reflect the needs and aspirations of the people of Dookie and District. Building on this process the 2017 plan provided another opportunity to align community goals with emerging challenges and opportunities.

Following a new round of consultation, we present the 2026 Community Plan. This updated plan will guide the work of the Dookie and District Development Forum over the coming years. To remain responsive, the Action Plan (included at the end of this document) will be reviewed annually, ensuring that actions continue to reflect the evolving needs of our community.

We invite you to explore this plan, share in its vision, and consider joining the Committee to help bring these aspirations to life.

## Our Plan

In updating our plan, Dookie District Development Forum wanted to get as much input from the Dookie and District community as possible. We realised the importance of giving every resident in the area a chance to have their say and guide the future direction of the region.

- The action plan was posted on the community Facebook page and people provided feedback
- A copy was attached in the Saddleback News, a local monthly newsletter
- Two letterbox drops occurred
- Local service clubs and organisations were approached by Dookie and District Development Forum members to increase survey participation.
- The DDDF hosted a BBQ where printed copies of the draft action plan were distributed, and feedback was collated through conversations and people providing their input on sticky notes and butcher’s paper – over 50 participants attended.

## What We Heard from the Community

We had a great response from the community, both in terms of the quantity of feedback received and the quality of feedback. This feedback allowed us to see if the actions contained within the 2017 Dookie Community Plan were still current, as well as gather new actions that are pertinent to the area going forward. As per previous Dookie and District Community Plans, we have divided the actions up into five pillars. These pillars include:

1. Social – projects and events that increase social connectedness in the town
2. Economic – actions that can stimulate our local economy and drive business
3. Built – buildings, facilities and services that are important to our continued well-being and growth
4. Natural/Environment – ways in which we can increase the enjoyment of our natural environment
5. Advocacy – promoting community interests through active engagement and representation

- Increased activity at the Dookie College Campus incorporating the local community
- Develop the Dookie Website
- Delivery of community support services

### Economic

- Overnight parking for RV vehicles and other opportunities to improve visitation to Dookie
- Support and maintain local businesses
